and King one to shoot a four-under 67 which, added to their Saturday tally of 68, gave them a seven-under 135. That was one stroke better than Smith and Care, who finished with 67—136.

McMahon's, fine putting resulted in putts of from four to 25 feet. It was a four-footer on the 15th and a 25-footers on the 16th that clinched the match for collegians McMahon (Villanova) and King (Wyo-

ming).  
A couple of swingers from Colonial CC of Harrisburg, Ron Sweger and Joe Gravino, collected five birds for 67 and 137

for third place. Another 67 was turned in by Jim Mooney, home club and Sal Furillo, Jeffersonville, who finished with 142. Furillo had seven birds with four bogeys.

Low net honors went to John Storti, Oak Terrace and Harry Venezia, Spring-Ford, with 126.
